THE SHOW GOES ON IN A NEW LOCATION...Our 51th Anniversary GMWC August Show & Sale at Birds of Vermont Museum Saturday, August 17, 2024

In 2023, we reached a milestone, with our 50th Annual August Show and Sale at the Rusty Parker Park in downtown Waterbury Vermont. While we continue to have many of our members participating in the Show, both the number of tables and the public attending have dropping. Last year the Town had mentioned there would be some changes to use of the Park this year as the Town and Village were merging. The result was this year we needed to file and pay for both an "Entertainment Permit" to use the Park and an approval of the Select Board, plus anyone



selling needed to have a "Vendor's Permit as well as carrying liability insurance, a lot of new obstacles. As we have been holding the Show for 50 years and want to continue, Matt and I talked about the issues and what will our next 50 years look like, and came up with an idea, talked with The Birds of Vermont Museum and was discussed at the April CarveIn. In August we hold a 3 Day Carving Class at the Museum, why not move the Show to the Museum, and start a "4 day Festival of WoodCarving". We are now all set, so circle Saturday, August 17th on your calendar, and plan on attending. This is a good opportunity to get together with fellow carvers, show your work, and get more people interested in woodcarving. We can think of our Annual Show as a large outdoor CarveIn where we invite the public to join us. Please plan on joining us to celebrate our 51st year of our Annual Public Carving Show.

August 14-16, 2024 3 Day Carving Class: Mallard Drake Decoy w/ Matthew Strong

For our 3 Day August Class again to be held at the Birds of Vermont Museum, we have decided to stay with a wildfowl theme and will be carving a $\frac{3}{4}$ scale Mallard Drake. Matthew Strong will cover the carving and Bob Lindemann will assist with the painting. As with the Swan, each carver will have the option of creating the piece from a simple working



decoy, and antique piece, smoothie or a more detailed wildfowl carving. We will keep the cost of the class at \$120, plus a small materials fee collected at the class. lunch, Matt had to leave while the remainder we continued carving till around 2:30 when it was time to head home.


July 13th, 2024 CarveIn

Follow Rt 100B through Moretown and continue to Waitsfield at the Library, turn left on Bridge St-East Warren Rd. Through the covered Bridge, and follow the road up the hill to the right, turn right at Palmer Lane. Watch for the first intersection (sometimes hidden with trees, and in a left bend in the road) and turn right on Sugarhouse lane, he are the first house on the left, it is a gray house, with a long driveway, 71 Sugarhouse lane. 802-496-3450
