All morning long we carved, painted and had several good conversations. Our new member also a Matt brought along his the two mallards he was working on as well as his father, and they tackled carving dogs. By mid afternoon when we cleaned up around 2:00 we had quite a kennel full of Dogs , as well as a few Mallards base painted and ready for the final details. 2024 GMWC Annual Meeting Birds of Vermont Museum, Huntington, VT

The 2024 Annual Meeting and October Carve-In was held at the Birds of Vermont Museum in Huntington on Saturday, October 12, 2024, with marginal fall foliage here, but those coming from the south reported very nice foilage and cool weather outside. Following a morning of carving, and talking about several Club Issues, President Matthew Strong called the meeting to order at 12:25. 6 members of the Club attended the Business Meeting.

Officers Reports:

Bob Lindemann Club Secretary handed out copies of the 2023 Meeting Minutes as well as the Financial Report not available at last year's meeting, and read some of the highlights of the meeting. The report was accepted as printed. Treasurer Barb Taylor, read thru the Treasurers Report, the final bank balance statement had not yet arrived, however it showed we made a \$140.05 this past year. President Strong moved on to Old Business.

Old Business:

The August Mallard Drake Carving class went very well, with 9 carvers attending. We were able to get the majority of the Ducks finished and ready to paint, while others are finishing the details and we are using the CarveIns and email tutorials to finish the painting process. Being able to complete the carving as a "slick" or spend more time on details is a definite plus for the Classes. Likewise, Matt reported the Show at the Museum was a great success. We

had great participation by Club members as well as a large number of visitors from the Museum, seeing how carvings are created. WCAX even sent a reporter to cover this year's Show.

New Business:

A motion was made to donate \$300 To Birds of Vermont for helping host the Show and Class, motion passed. What should be the subject for our 2023 August Class? Several ides were passed on from members including a Santa on a Loon like our past Santa on a Moose class, a Blue Heron, an Owl or maybe a turtle? We have a number of carvers that take the class each year and need ideas of what they would like to see in 2025. Let us know and possible email to past participants for input.

This year's meeting was the first Saturday to help avoid Leaf Peeper traffic, traffic this week has already been heavy, we may continue the first Saturday, and the Bylaws allow any weekend in October, so the last weekend is another possibility if needed.

A motion was made to ask the Secretary to cast one vote to reelect all of the present Officers, the motion was seconded & passed.

Directions:



It went over so well that over half the carvers were focused that day working on carving hound dogs. Looking thru my collection of patterns, I came across this one, and here is a chance to try your knife after another one to add to your kennel. The original was on light blue paper, so the pattern is a bit on the dark side. Enlarge to 1" squares.
